The mission of the Idaho Human Rights Education Center is to *“promote respect for human dignity and diversity through education and to foster individual responsibility to work for justice and peace.”*

The Center achieves this mission through educational programs with teachers and students, community leadership and advocacy in human rights. The Center was founded in 1996 to construct a memorial to human rights. In August 2002, that vision became a reality when the Idaho Anne Frank Human Rights Memorial opened to the public. Today, thousands of school children and adults tour the Memorial each year and participate in our programs.

The Idaho Human Rights Education Center is 100% dependent on donations.

Because of the generous contributions of our supporters, these are some of our ongoing programs:

- Our comprehensive K-12 “Scope & Sequence” of human rights classroom lessons developed with the Idaho State Department of Education and authored by Idaho teachers as the only one of its kind in the nation;
- An annual statewide human rights art contest for K-12 students;
- The “History of Human Rights in Idaho,” a multi-media project;
- “Speech that Hurts” cards and booklets containing the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in English and Spanish;
- The “Orientation Guide for Immigrants to Idaho,” containing resources for immigrant and refugee families;
- Human rights/diversity training for educator, student, business and nonprofit groups each year;
- Collaboration with more than 20 organizations statewide and regionally to advance human rights;
- Annual human rights month programming at Boise State University featuring human rights speakers of international fame;
- Creation and nonprofit fiscal sponsorship of the Idaho Safe Schools Coalition;
- Organization of Human Rights Education Missions to Germany, Poland, the Netherlands, the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland, China, and Korea for Idaho educators and administrators;
- Creation of over 60 classroom lessons designed to bring global connections, global cultures, and global issues into Idaho’s classrooms;
- Administration of the Center for Civic Education’s Project Citizen curriculum program in Idaho;
- Partnership with Cooperation Ireland in the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland in CivicLink—an adaptation of Project Citizen for use in a divided society;
- Teacher training in Kosova on the implementation of CivicLink for reconciliation through civic education;
- Program development with AFS Intercultural Programs on Global LEAP, a three-week leadership development program for school administrators from Bolivia, Ecuador, and Venezuela conducted in Boise, Idaho; and
- Project management of the development of (17) e-learning Project Citizen lessons produced in both Arabic and English for the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan.
